If your gift is prophesying, then prophesy in accordance with your faith;  $^{7}$ if it is serving, then serve; if it is teaching, then teach; <sup>8</sup> if it is to encourage, then give encouragement; if it is giving, then give generously; if it is to lead, do it diligently; if it is to show mercy, do it cheerfully. ### **TEACHING SUMMARY:**

Groups of people are often known for what they are against rather than what they are for. This can stretch into politics, one group is against immigration and another is against guns, one is against abortion and the other is against discrimination. Clubs and other organizations have a tendency to be the same way. Those communities of people are most widely known for what they are against.

The new community that Jesus established in the Church wasn't designed that way. It isn't called to be known for what it is against. The Church, Jesus' new community, is called to be set apart- and be so radically for others that no one can mistake it for anything else.

We, the Church, are called to be radically devoted to others and be willing to, like Jesus, sacrifice ourselves in order to lead others into relationship with the Father.
