

SERIES BIG IDEA:

Jesus used culturally relevant stories to teach timeless kingdom truths to bring people to God.

Tend the flock of God that is in your charge, not by constraint but willingly, not for shameful gain but eagerly, not as domineering over those in your charge but being examples to the flock.

1 Peter 5:2-3 RSV

Caring for others is a calling of provision, protection, and guidance.

Cue 2: Benny's world revolved around, first, providing for his sister Joon.

Clip 2 (2:18)

We follow the example of the Good Shepherd as we care for others.

The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want; he makes me lie down in green pastures. He leads me beside still waters; he restores my soul.

Psalm 23:1-3a RSV

Cue 3: A curveball named Sam was thrown into Benny and Joon's life and they initially had different responses.

Clip 3 (3:11)

Caring for others, at times, involves protecting others against themselves and outside influences.

Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I fear no evil; for thou art with me; thy rod and thy staff, they comfort me. Psalm 23:4 RSV

Cue 4: Benny was a protector because it wasn't always easy for Joon to accept change.

Clip 4 (2:11)

Being a caring guide for others as they walk through life's hardships requires trust.

He leads me in paths of righteousness for his name's sake.

Psalm 23:3B RSV

If we aren't constantly working to build trust you are working at losing it.

Cue 5: Benny continues to build trust by doing something simple...he stops and listens.

Clip 5 (1:47)

Being an under shepherd in the Kingdom requires trusting the Good Shepherd with what only He can do.

Humble yourselves therefore under the mighty hand of God, that in due time he may exalt you. Cast all your anxieties on him, for he cares for you.

1 Peter 5:6-7



Cue 7: Benny finds himself having to step out of his comfort zone and trust others to support him as he cares for Joon.

Clip 7 (4:33)

TEACHING BIG IDEA

I will fulfill my role as under shepherd in the Kingdom and trust Jesus to do all I am not called to do.

When we let go and trust God to be the ultimate guide and goal of our caring relationships, He can and will bring people to Him.

Thou preparest a table before me in the presence of my enemies; thou anointeth my head with oil, my cup overflows. Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life; and I will dwell in the house of the Lord forever.

Psalm 23:5-6

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TEACHING SUMMARY:

It has been said that without the tangible presence of care there cannot be the tangible presence of community and that a simple act of caring for others is simply heroic.

Scripture tells us to love one another.

We are to show immense care for each other and if we call upon Christ as Lord we have been given the ultimate example of how to care for others.

We have been shown through how we are loved and how Christ has shown up in our lives how we are supposed to do that as well. The call of a caring shepherd is a call of provision, protection, and guidance.
