

The **<u>Bible</u>** is not the foundation for our faith.

The <u>resurrection</u> of <u>Jesus</u> is the foundation of our faith.

Because of the resurrection of Jesus, we have the Bible.

"All authority in heaven and earth has been given to me." Matthew 28:18 (NIV)

<u>Jesus</u> is our <u>authority</u>.

- The question we need to wrestle with is "Who is Jesus?" before we ask "What is the Bible?"
- Jesus is the cornerstone of our faith and He exercises His authority through the Bible, directing our <u>beliefs</u> and giving us <u>wisdom</u> for life.

SERIES BIG IDEA:

Jesus' resurrection gives me the confidence to trust scripture to guide my beliefs and actions.

The Bible is an ancient, ambiguous, and diverse collection of divinely inspired scriptures that are active in leading us into a <u>relationship</u> with God and giving us <u>wisdom</u> for life.

Jesus said the <u>Hebrew</u> scriptures (the <u>Old</u> Testament) point to Him.

²⁵He said to them, "How foolish you are, and how slow to believe all that the prophets have spoken! ²⁶Did not the Messiah have to suffer these things and then enter his glory?" ²⁷And beginning with Moses and all the Prophets, he explained to them what was said in all the Scriptures concerning himself. Luke 24:25-27 (NIV)

The <u>Hebrew</u> scriptures are called the TaNaK (Torah, Nevi'im, and Ketuvim) which contains 39 books written over a span of 1000 years in Hebrew and Aramaic.

Jesus endorsed the TaNak by claiming He was the Old Covenant's fulfillment.

"Do not think that I have come to abolish the Law or the Prophets; I have not come to abolish them but to fulfill them." Matthew 5:17 (NIV)

When the early church met together, they devoted themselves to the Apostle's teachings. (Acts 2:42)

¹⁸Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. ¹⁹Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." Matthew 28:18-20 (NIV)

The <u>New</u> Testament is comprised of four unique accounts of Jesus' story and teachings, one book of church history, 21 letters from the 1st Century Apostolic leaders, and one book of prophecy.



In the 4th Century, the Hebrew Scriptures were combined with the 27 New Testament writings into one book named "<u>Ta Biblia</u>" (The Bible).

We must start with Jesus and read all scripture through the lens of Jesus as the <u>Savior</u> of our sins and the <u>Lord</u> whom we obey and follow.

We read and trust scripture because we trust that Jesus is <u>alive</u> and, therefore, He is our Lord.
