## The Bible is a reliable collection of poetry, history, romance, prophecy, and letters.

- Literary accuracy because of corroboration
- Manuscript evidence
- Archaeological evidence
- Falsifiable claims

# The Bible was written by contemporaries.

• Contemporary - noun - a person or thing living or existing at the same time as another

The Bible contains eyewitness accounts of God's supernatural intervention.

The Bible contains the story of Jesus, who fulfilled very specific prophecies.

#### The Bible contains claims of divine inspiration.

<sup>16</sup>for we did not follow cleverly devised stories when we told you about the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ in power, but we were eyewitnesses of his majesty. <sup>17</sup>He received honor and glory from God the Father when the voice came to him from the Majestic Glory, saying, "This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased." <sup>18</sup>We ourselves heard this voice that came from heaven when we were with him on the sacred mountain.

<sup>19</sup>We also have the prophetic message as something completely reliable, and you will do well to pay attention to it, as to a light shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts. <sup>20</sup>Above all, you must understand that no prophecy of Scripture came about by the prophet's own interpretation of things. <sup>21</sup>For prophecy never had its origin in the human will, but prophets, though human, spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit.

TEACHING BIG IDEA

I can trust the <u>reliability</u> of the Bible because of evidence, eyewitnesses, and logic.

The Old Testament narrative points to Jesus; the New Testament narrative tells us of His life, ministry, death, and resurrection and gives us <u>wisdom</u> on how we should live.

<sup>1</sup>Now, brothers and sisters, I want to remind you of the gospel I preached to you, which you received and on which you have taken your stand. <sup>2</sup>By this gospel you are saved, if you hold firmly to the word I preached to you. Otherwise, you have believed in vain.

<sup>3</sup>For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, ⁴that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures, ⁵and that he appeared to Cephas, and then to the Twelve. ⁶After that, he appeared to more than five hundred of the brothers and sisters at the same time, most of whom are still living, though some have fallen asleep. <sup>7</sup>Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles, 8 and last of all he appeared to me also, as to one abnormally born.
