TEACHING SUMMARY:

The Gospel of Matthew records four different times where Jesus told the disciples that he would die and come back to life (Matthew 16:21; 17:23; 20:19; 26:32) yet none of them believed this after Jesus died. That is, until they saw a resurrected Jesus.

Up until the resurrection of Jesus, sin and death had the power and authority over all humanity. When Jesus came back to life, He took back the authority that our sin had over us. Jesus is the Victorious King who invites all humanity to receive His salvation by confessing Him as Lord.

The resurrection of Jesus was the evidence the disciples needed to believe that Jesus was all He claimed to be. What we believe about the resurrection will determine who Jesus is to us. Who Jesus is to us will lead us to live as if He is our Victorious King, or we will live like Jesus is nothing to us.

When Jesus is our Victorious King, we experience the joy of His love, and we will stand in awe of His power.
