

### Who we are determines what we are for.

## SERIES BIG IDEA:

We are forgiven so we can be given for Jesus, for His church, and for our cities.

### We are for <u>Jesus</u> because Jesus is for <u>us</u>. (1 John 4:19)

<sup>14</sup>For this reason I kneel before the Father, <sup>15</sup>from whom every family in heaven and on earth derives its name. <sup>16</sup>pray that out of his glorious riches he may strengthen you with power through his Spirit in your inner being, <sup>17</sup>so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith. And I pray that you, being rooted and established in love, <sup>18</sup>may have power, together with all the Lord's holy people, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ, <sup>19</sup>and to know this love that surpasses knowledge—that you may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God.

<sup>20</sup>Now to him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work within us, <sup>21</sup>to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, for ever and ever! Amen. Ephesians 3:14-21 (NIV)

### God's power is at work within me, and He is able to do more through us, the Church, when I live for Him.

## When I discover what I am for, I discover my purpose.

#### TEACHING BIG IDEA:

My purpose is to become like <u>Jesus</u> and use my gifts to be a gift to the <u>body</u> of Christ so that we fulfill Jesus' mission.

### We share a <u>universal</u> calling to become like <u>Jesus</u>.

<sup>1</sup>As a prisoner for the Lord, then, I urge you to live a life worthy of the calling you have received. <sup>2</sup>Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love. <sup>3</sup>Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace. <sup>4</sup>There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to one hope when you were called; <sup>5</sup>one Lord, one faith, one baptism; <sup>6</sup>one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all.

Ephesians 4:1-6 (NIV)

## Our universal calling is to grow in our <u>character</u> so that we reflect Jesus' <u>character</u>.

<sup>7</sup>But to each one of us grace has been given as Christ apportioned it. <sup>8</sup>This is why it says: "When he ascended on high, he took many captives and gave gifts to his people." <sup>9</sup>(What does "he ascended" mean except that he also descended to the lower, earthly regions? <sup>10</sup>He who descended is the very one who ascended higher than all the heavens, in order to fill the whole universe.)

<sup>11</sup>So Christ himself gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the pastors and teachers, <sup>12</sup>to equip his people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up <sup>13</sup>until we all reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God and become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ.

Ephesians 4:7-13 (NIV)

## My unique calling is to be a gift for the $\underline{church}$ and use my gifts for God's purposes.

- God has uniquely shaped me to equip others in the church.
- My unique calling is to be an expression of Jesus' presence by embracing my role in <u>APEST</u>. (v11)
- I <u>mature</u> when I grow in my character (universal calling) and operate in my giftedness (my unique calling).



# My role is to <u>equip</u> the body of Christ for works of service so that we are <u>unified</u> in our faith and knowledge of Jesus and live in the fullness of Christ.

<sup>14</sup>Then we will no longer be infants, tossed back and forth by the waves, and blown here and there by every wind of teaching and by the cunning and craftiness of people in their deceitful scheming. <sup>15</sup>Instead, speaking the truth in love, we will grow to become in every respect the mature body of him who is the head, that is, Christ. <sup>16</sup>From him the whole body, joined and held together by every supporting ligament, grows and builds itself up in love, as each part does its work. Ephesians 4:1-16 (NIV)

I will do my part to be given for the church so we grow and build ourselves up in Christ's love.
