TEACHING SUMMARY:

There are people all around us who are questioning "who God is, what God is like, and who God likes?"

When we receive salvation by trusting in Jesus' perfect life, sacrificial death, and life-giving resurrection, we receive a calling to join Him on His mission reverse the curse of sin.
