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TEACHING SUMMARY:

As our relationship with Jesus becomes more intimate, we learn that Jesus is our Mighty God. When we worship God, both as a community of believers and individually, we sing; we have joy; we extol Him; and we thank Him. Worship becomes our response as we understand who God is.

Understanding Jesus as our Mighty God underscores our understanding of His role as our Creator. He made the depths of the earth, the sea, and the mountains. The ultimate of His creation is that He is our Maker. When we embrace Jesus as our Mighty God, we can also embrace that He cares for us as His people—part of His flock as we live in His pasture.

Not everyone who knows about the amazing acts of God responds with trust. The example from the nation of Israel is that a generation who knew God's miracles rejected God and never experienced His rest. This example serves as a warning for us. If we are not experiencing the rest and the peace that God desires for us, we need to return to our declaration of Jesus being our Mighty God.
