

The Power to Save us

WEEK ONE

The message of Jesus and His kingdom is good news for those who can't have enough and those who can't be enough.

⁴⁴"The kingdom of heaven is like treasure hidden in a field. When a man found it, he hid it again, and then in his joy went and sold all he had and bought that field. ⁴⁵"Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant looking for fine pearls. ⁴⁶When he found one of great value, he went away and sold everything he had and bought it.

SERIES BIG IDEA:

The gospel is the power of God to save and transform all who know it, trust in it, and share it.

The good news of Jesus is how God reveals the way to be right with Him through faith in Who Jesus is and what Jesus has done for us.

To know and trust the Gospel is to trust in the Power of God to save us.

The bad news is that all creation is broken under the powerful curse of sin.

The Good News of Jesus is:

- Jesus lived the perfect life I couldn't live.
- Jesus died to pay the penalty I couldn't pay.
- Jesus came back to life to give life to all who trust in and follow Him.

The gospel is God's power that is eternally saving us by continually transforming us to restore us into who God created us to be.

Four phases of God's saving work for us and in us:

1. Justification

Romans 3:22-26

In Jesus, I am just as if I've never sinned. I am made perfect because Jesus lived perfectly and died for my sin's penalty.

2. Sanctification

2 Corinthians 5:17: Romans 12:1-2: Romans 15:16

The Holy Spirit lives in me and is continually transforming me to become like Jesus and follow His truth.

3. Glorification

1 Corinthians 15:40, 42-44, 49-58



The suffering our bodies experience will be exchanged one day with a glorified body, and we will be with Jesus forever.

4. Restoration

Revelation 21:1-5

Jesus will restore <u>all</u> things including my soul, my body, and this earth so that we can enjoy <u>God</u> together, forever.

TEACHING SUMMARY:

The gospel is absurd and the life of Jesus is meaningless unless we believe that He lived, died, and rose again with but one purpose in mind: to make brand-new creation. Not to make people with better morals but to create a community of prophets and professional lovers, men and women who would surrender to the mystery of the fire of the Spirit that burns within, who would live in ever greater fidelity to the omnipresent Word of God, who would enter into the center of it all, the very heart and mystery of Christ, into the center of the flame that consumes, purifies, and sets everything aglow with peace, joy, boldness, and extravagant, furious love. ~ Brennan Manning
