¹⁸ Once when Jesus was praying in private and his disciples were with him, he asked them, "Who do the crowds say I am?" ¹⁹ They replied, "Some say John the Baptist; others say Elijah; and still others, that one of the prophets of long ago has come back to life."

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TEACHING SUMMARY:

Culture baits us into the celebrity trap teasing us that true life is experienced when we are famous. The four Gospels do more than just tell us what Jesus did and what He taught, they show Jesus as our model for living life.

Jesus resisted the temptation to pursue making Himself famous. He trusted that God would exalt Him in time. Until that time, Jesus modeled what it looked like to deny oneself, die to oneself daily, and live a life of humility that is fully obedient to God's will.

We can't live like Jesus on our own power. We need the Holy Spirit's power. Jesus models how we can depend on the Holy Spirit's power to walk in humility and gloify Jesus.

Through fasting, prayer, and God's word, the Holy Spirit will empower us to have humility and deny oursleves, daily die to ourselves, and follow Jesus to glorify Him.
