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TEACHING SUMMARY:

What you choose to fight for reveals what is most important to you. Israel wanted the Messiah to come and fight for their religious and national freedom. Jesus Christ came to fight for something more important—their spiritual freedom.

Jesus fought the power of temptations to conquer the evil that enslaves humanity in the darkness of eternal death. Jesus defeated temptation with the power of God's Spirit and the power of the God's Word.
