MARRIED TEACHING BIG IDEA:

A <u>Jesus</u>-centered <u>marriage</u> is the best gift we can give our children.

SINGLE'S TEACHING BIG IDEA:

A Jesus-centered life is the best gift to give to those around me.

My marriage is the foundation to my family.

Marriage should be honored by all, and the marriage bed kept pure, for God will judge the adulterer and all the sexually immoral. Hebrews 13:4 (NIV)

Marriage is to be honored because it is a reflection of our Holy God.

They forbid people to marry and order them to abstain from certain foods, which God created to be received with thanksgiving by those who believe and who know the truth.

1 Timothy 4:3 (NIV)

Marriage is a gift from God that we receive with thanksgiving.

³²I would like you to be free from concern. An unmarried man is concerned about the Lord's affairs—how he can please the Lord. ³³But a married man is concerned about the affairs of this world—how he can please his wife—³⁴and his interests are divided. An unmarried woman or virgin is concerned about the Lord's affairs: Her aim is to be devoted to the Lord in both body and spirit. But a married woman is concerned about the affairs of this world—how she can please her husband. ³⁵I am saying this for your own good, not to restrict you, but that you may live in a right way in undivided devotion to the Lord.

1 Corinthians 7:32-35 (NIV)

Marriage is a commitment to the Lord by ministering to our spouse.

Being single is also a gift so we can commit our lives to following Jesus.

¹Follow God's example, therefore, as dearly loved children ²and walk in the way of love, just as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us as a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God.

Ephesians 5:1-2 (NIV)

We are to follow God's example of selfless love.



The best gift a husband can give is living Jesus-centered by <u>loving</u> and <u>honoring</u> his wife the way Jesus loves him. Ephesians 5:21-28

The best gift a wife can give is living Jesus-centered by <u>loving</u> and <u>respecting</u> her husband the way Jesus loves her. Ephesians 5:33

When Jesus is the center of our lives, we can make it through anything in this life.





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TEACHING SUMMARY:

"I have been crucified with Christ. It is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me. And the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me." ~ Galatians 2:20

Living a life centered on Christ is the call for all of us who call Jesus, Lord. It is also a gift. A Jesus-centered life is a gift given to us by God through the sacrifice of His son; and, it is a gift for us to give as an example to our spouse, children, and the people around us.
