



SERIES BIG IDEA:

Jesus is _____; therefore, He is _____.

The Feast of Tabernacles (Feast of Booths or Ingathering) was a Hebrew tradition God commanded Moses to have Israel observe to _____ Israel of His delivering them from Egypt. (Exodus 23:14-16)

The Feast of Tabernacles included two reminders:

- A ceremony of drawing _____ from the Pool of Siloam to remember how God provided Israel water from the rock in Horeb (Exodus 17:6).
- Each evening, there was a ceremonial _____ of lamps to remember the pillar of fire that protected Israel in the darkness (Exodus 13:21).

³⁷ On the last and greatest day of the festival, Jesus stood and said in a loud voice, "Let anyone who is thirsty come to me and drink. ³⁸ Whoever believes in me, as Scripture has said, rivers of living water will flow from within them." ³⁹ By this he meant the Spirit, whom those who believed in him were later to receive. Up to that time the Spirit had not been given, since Jesus had not yet been glorified. ⁴⁰ On hearing his words, some of the people said, "Surely this man is the Prophet." ⁴¹ Others said, "He is the Messiah." Still others asked, "How can the Messiah come from Galilee? ⁴² Does not Scripture say that the Messiah will come from David's descendants and from Bethlehem, the town where David lived?" ⁴³ Thus the people were divided because of Jesus. ⁴⁴ Some wanted to seize him, but no one laid a hand on him.

¹³ The Pharisees challenged him, "Here you are, appearing as your own witness; your testimony is not valid." ¹⁴ Jesus answered, "Even if I testify on my own behalf, my testimony is valid, for I know where I came from and where I am going. But you have no idea where I come from or where I am going. ¹⁵ You judge by human standards; I pass judgment on no one. ¹⁶ But if I do judge, my decisions are true, because I am not alone. TEACHING SUMMARY:

Jesus leveraged the most popular and celebrated festival, the Feast of Tabernacles, to announce another one of His "I Am" statements. Around the glow of torches, Jesus shares that He is "The Light of the World."

Light is the source of our life on earth and Jesus is the source of all life created. When Jesus made this claim, He was claiming He was the reason for all life and the only way to have life.

The opposite of light is darkness. Jesus made a promise that whoever follows Him will not walk in darkness. When we try to walk in darkness, we stumble, we fall, we stub our toe, or step on that lego. Jesus makes a promise that to follow Him we will not walk in darkness but have life.

To follow Jesus is to experience living life in the light and experiencing God's kingdom life. What is your plan to follow Jesus so you can avoid the darkness and walk in His light to experience His life for you?
