



THE SEVEN CLAIMS OF JESUS

If God were here, wouldn't He stop this?

SERIES BIG IDEA: Jesus is <u>God;</u> therefore, He is <u>Lord</u>.

²... "Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher who has come from God. For no one could perform the signs you are doing if God were not with him." ³ Jesus replied, "Very truly I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God unless they are born again..."

¹² "I have spoken to you of earthly things and you do not believe; how then will you believe if I speak of heavenly things? ¹³ No one has ever gone into heaven except the one who came from heaven—the Son of Man. ¹⁴ Just as Moses lifted up the snake in the wilderness, so the Son of Man must be lifted up, ¹⁵ that everyone who believes may have eternal life in him."

¹⁶ For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. ¹⁷ For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him. John 3:2-3, 12-17 (NIV)

- Humanity is caught in a web of selfishness and sin that leads to <u>brokenness</u> and <u>death</u>.
- The good news of Jesus is that Jesus has the power to remove the curse of sin and give new life to all who trust in Him.
- We must keep in mind the <u>heavenly</u> story that God is writing through our <u>earthly</u> circumstances.

¹¹ Now a man named Lazarus was sick. He was from Bethany, the village of Mary and her sister Martha. ² (This Mary, whose brother Lazarus now lay sick, was the same one who poured perfume on the Lord and wiped his feet with her hair.) ³ So the sisters sent word to Jesus, "Lord, the one you love is sick." ⁴ When he heard this, Jesus said, "This sickness will not end in death. No, it is for God's glory so that God's Son may be glorified through it." ⁵ Now Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus. John 11:1-5 (NIV)

God's <u>love</u> for us doesn't mean <u>bad</u> things won't happen to us.

⁶ So when he heard that Lazarus was sick, he stayed where he was two more days, ⁷ and then he said to his disciples, "Let us go back to Judea." John 11:6-7 (NIV)

Jesus shows us the love that God has for all humanity.

John 11:17-37

Jesus' response to Martha:

²³ Jesus said to her, "Your brother will rise again." ²⁴ Martha answered, "I know he will rise again in the resurrection at the last day." ²⁵ Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life. The one who believes in me will live, even though they die; ²⁶ and whoever lives by believing in me will never die. Do you believe this?"

John 11:23-26 (NIV)

Jesus' response to Mary:

³³ When Jesus saw her weeping, and the Jews who had come along with her also weeping, he was deeply moved in spirit and troubled. ³⁴ "Where have you laid him?" he asked.

"Come and see, Lord," they replied. ³⁵ Jesus wept. John 11:33-35 (NIV)

John 19:40-44

When he had received the drink, Jesus said, "It is finished." With that, he bowed his head and gave up his spirit. John 19:30 (NIV)

- To be born again means to have <u>new life</u> in Christ.
