# Four pillars of Biblical Community: Bible Reading, Gathering, Connection, and Prayer

## TEACHING BIG IDEA:

I build my faith in biblical community through shared experiences and prayer.

# When built upon the solid ground of Jesus, communion with others deepens our bond with Jesus and each other.

When the day of Pentecost come, they were all together in one place. Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. They saw what appeared to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them. Now there were standing in Jerusalem God-fearing Jews from every nation under heaven. When they heard this sound, a crowd came together in bewilderment, because each one heard them speaking in his own language. Acts 2:1-6

# The communion built in mutual experiences allows us to <u>learn</u> from one another, <u>build</u> one another up, and <u>acknowledge</u> our weakness and needs.

All the believers were together and had everything in common. Selling their possessions and goods, they gave to everyone as he had need. Acts 2:44-45

# Praying for each other causes us to deepen our trust in Jesus.

Prayer is not asking. Prayer is putting oneself in the hands of God, at His disposition, and listening to His voice in the depth of our hearts. Mother Teresa

# Praying for each other causes us to extend a bridge of trust to each other.

Christian fellowship lives and exists by the intercession of its members for one another, or it collapses. I can no longer condemn or hate a brother for whom I pray, no matter how much trouble he causes me. His face, that may have been strange and intolerable to me, is transformed in intercession into the countenance of a brother for whom Christ died, the face of a forgiven sinner. Dietrich Bonhoeffer

# Praying for each other causes us to <u>act</u> out our faith in Jesus.

What good is it, my brothers, if a man claims to have faith but has no deeds? Can such a faith save him? Suppose a brother or sister is without clothes and daily food. If one of you says to him, "Go, I wish you well; keep warm and well fed," but does nothing about his physical needs, what good is it? In the same way faith by itself, if not accompanied by action, is dead. But someone will say, "You have faith; I have deeds." Show me your faith without deeds and I will show you my faith by what I do. James 2:14-18



Building our faith with Scripture, Community, Connection, and Prayer reminds of us our solid ground, His sacrifice, and leads us to action.

We <u>act</u> out our faith because of our solid ground, the <u>resurrected</u> Jesus.
